Silk scarf painting

Dye-Na-Flow Paints—General directions:

- 1. Dampen scarf with water
- 2. Squirt or paint on colors
- 3. Let dry

OR

- 1. Roll, crumble, rubber band or otherwise manipulate scarf
- 2. Apply paints with an eye dropper, small squirt bottle or brush
- 3. Mist thoroughly with water
- 4. Let dry.

OR

- 1. Crumble up scarf into baggie
- 2. Squirt paints (small amounts) into baggie
- 3. Optional: sprinkle in coarse salt
- 4. Close bag and knead it
- 5. Take out scarf after several hours and allow it to finish drying

"Fixing" the color with Dye-Na-Flow

- 1. Let dry thoroughly, preferably several days.
- 2. 2. Press (don't iron!) with dry (no steam!) iron on highest heat the fabric can take. (You can use a press cloth and a very high setting.)

These instructions will give you bleeding, "watercolor" effect color. For more controlled placement of color you can try

- 1. Resist painting (see Dharma Company web site)
- 2. Sun painting (see Dharma Company or Dick Blick websites)
- 3. Stamping

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Spectra Art Tissue—General directions:

- 1. Place tissue pieces on scarf
- 2. Mist thoroughly with water
- 3. Pat tissue completely onto scarf
- 4. Let dry

"Fixing" Color:

1. Press with hot iron

OR

2. Predampen scarf with vinegar and dry in the microwave

Note: Neither of these methods creates a truly colorfast fix.

This is a great project to do with children.
