(so silk won't stick)

2 Parts sugar to 1 part oil (Can also use salt or kosher salt; any kind of oil, including scented essential oils)

Use ¼ tsp to exfoliate hands; rinse with warm water

Concerning Bonnie Inouye's October Workshop "Big Twills":

For the Big Twill, the looms need to be warped and the first sample woven before the workshop begins. (She will send detailed instructions and drafts.) The warp needs to be white or a pale color, cotton, either 5/2 or 8/2 if that sounds reasonable to your group. Weft will be 8/2 or similar, cotton, in a dark or bright color. You will keep your weft as you go around the room. Then your samples are color coded and easy to retrieve at the end of the workshop.
