PUMPKIN CAKE -- SELMA

3 CUPS	BROWN SUGAR SPLENDA (1 FULL BAG) / OR REGULAR BROWN SUGAR IF PREFERRED
4 EGGS	
2/3 CUP	WATER
3 ½ CUPS	ALL PURPOSE FLOUR
1 TSP.	CINNAMON
1 TSP.	NUTMEG
2 TSP.	BAKING SODA
1 CUP	VEG. COOKING OIL
15 OZ. CAN	PUMPKIN
1 TSP.	SALT
10 OZ. BAG	CHOCOLATE CHIPS – OPTIONAL
1 CUP	NUTS – OPTIONAL

USE A LARGE BUNT PAN AND COAT IT WELL WITH BAKER'S JOY NO STICK BAKING SPRAY WITH FLOUR (I FIND IF I USE THIS SPRAY AND LET THE CAKE COOL, IT COMES OUT PERFECT.)

COMBINE VEG.OIL, EGGS AND MIX TIL SMOOTH, ADD PUMPKIN, PUT IN DRY INGREDIENTS A LITTLE AT A TIME, WATER, FLOUR, CHIPS, ETC. AND MIX WELL

BAKE AT 350 FOR ABOUT AN HOUR, BAKE UNTIL A TOOTHPICK COMES OUT CLEAN.
