- July 17th: Tina Christensen-Parm, Spinning Boucle, 3-ply, Tina demonstrated using one mohair handspun and playing it slipped with a Polyester thread to create loops, then plied a third time with polyester to lock in loops. She shared the thread she is using that she likes for ease of use and affordability as well as her favorite book Spinners by Sarah Anderson. Tina brought in several examples for projects she completed using boucle as well as several skeins of yarn for inspirations. Dee demonstrated chain plying, also referred to as Navajo ply. Tina has purchased mohair from Hidden Pastures Thank you Tina!
